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THE CONCEPT OF GUNA AND THE ROLE OF VISHADA GUNA IN MANAGEMENT OF VICHARCHIKA

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ABSTRACT

Skin is the largest protective organ of the body. A healthy skin is the mirror image of a good health. Skin diseases though afflicts bodily but gives lot of psychological conflicts and can harm affected individual in a number of ways like discomfort, disfigurement, disability and death. Though the disease, *Vicharchika* is not a life threatening, it makes the patient worried due to its appearance, severe itching, disturbing routine and its chronic nature. According to *Acharya Charak Vicharchika* disease is caused mainly by *Kapha dosha*. It has the symptoms like *Kandu* (Itching) and *Bahushrava*(excessive secretion) etc. In this clinical study *Vishada Guna* has been assessed in the management of *Vicharchika*. A detail description of *Vishada Guna* has been given to know its Physical, Physiological, Physiochemical and Pharmacological action.

1. INTRODUCTION

Skin is the largest protective organ of the body. A healthy skin is the mirror image of a good health. Though the disease, *Vicharchika* is not a life threatening, it makes the patient worried due to its appearance, severe itching, disturbing routine and its chronic nature. Almost all the scholars of *Ayurveda* of modern era consider *Vicharchika* as eczema in modern parlance. *Vicharchika* is described under *Kshudra Kustha* in *Ayurvedic* textual also mentioned as a curable disease, yet the relapsing nature of this disease makes it much harassment for patient and troubles some for physician too.


All the *Dravyas* in the universe are having *Guna*. Hence the knowledge of *Gunas* is a must. In Ayurveda, the knowledge of *Gunas* is useful for the protection of health, as well as treatment of the diseases.

Bhadant Nagarjuna has defined that *Guna* indicates the whole community of *Guna*.

- > Dravya and Guna have a Samvaya Sambandha.
- > Dravya is required for the expression of Guna.
- Guna is devoid of *Karma*.
- Guna is to be cause in production of similar Guna.

2. MATERIAL AND METHOD

Acharya Sushruta has divided the list of twenty Gunas in two parts. At the end of first part (after the explanation of ten Gunas). He says the ten Gunas are described with their *Karmas* and now remaining ten *Gunas* will be described. Here he has not used the word 'with *Karmas*' from the above discussion it is observed that controversy lies with these *Gunas* only. Hence it can be said that difference of opinion is more about the *Gunas*, which indicate physical properties. The next thing to be noted is that *Acharya Susrutas* list of *Gunas* shows more than twenty *Gunas*. He has described four solitary, unpaired *Gunas* namely *Vyavayi*, *Vikashi*, *Ashukari* and *Sukshma*. All these four *Gunas* are catabolic in nature and related with the *Gati*. After description of these four *Gunas* to be twenty.



GUNA OF VATA DOSHA

Vata Dosha being a *Dravya* also shows its own attributes or qualities, with the help of which it performs it's all actions or work in normal condition. These attributes are named as '*Aatmaroopa* or *Atmaguna*'. *Vata* acts as a causative factor for many diseases when these attributes becomes abnormal.

The qualities of *Vata dosha* can be described under the following headings-

PHYSICAL PROPERTIES

- Ruksha (Dryness) this is pathologically and clinically important property. This attribute keep balance with unctuousness of Kapha.
- Seeta (Coolness) clinically this attribute is important as little increase in this property leads to arrest of movements. This property balances heaviness warmth of *Pitta*.

- Laghu (lightness) this attribute is important as it balance heaviness of Kapha and little heavy property of Pitta.
- Sukşama (Micro-effects/subtle) This attribute makes this Dosha to reach ultimate units and spaces of internal body.
- Chala (Mobile) Due to this property it induces and controls all sorts of movements in living body. It is for this reason that this *Dosha* is called representive of *Chetana* principle of living body.
- Vishada (Clean) -Just as any flowing stream keeps clean only due to continuous movements, all dirt and dust particles are flown away, due to continuous movement this *Dosha* is responsible for mechanical cleaning of various types.
- Khara (Rough) As polishing paper makes surfaces of objects smooth, due to rough attribute of this Dosha, surfaces of tissues in contract remain smooth.

Daruna - Commentator Cakrapanidutt spells it as Soşhanatvata, absorption of moisture is expected. Other Acharya also described Guna of Vata in their text.

Vishada Guna play a major role in *Chikitsa* of *Vicharchika*, Ayurveda speaks much on the subjective rather than the objectivity. This is because; Ayurveda treats the patient, not the disease.

The Vishada Guna is the Viparita (antagonist) property of Picchila Guna. The description of Picchila Guna gives the idea about the particular property. In the treatment Viparita Chikitsa is always applied, so Vishada is applied in case of Picchila Guna Vridhi. A detail description of Vishada Guna has been given to know its Physical, Physiological, Physiochemical and Pharmacological action.

The Vishada Guna which is opposite to property of *Picchila Guna*, does *Shoshana* of *Sharir Kleda* and *vrana ropana*. It opens the circulatory channals and clear the mucal covering. It contist of the washing like action and helps in wound healing and alleviates *Kapha dosha*. *Ksara* (alkaline substances) is the example for *Vishada* attribute.

Physical structure of Vishada Guna is perceivable through Chakshu & Sparshendriya

Functions

The *Guna* through which *Dravya* is able to perform functions like *Shoshana* of *Kleda*, *Vranropana*, *Lekhana* of *Dhatu*, *Shoshana* of *Mala & Vata Vriddhi is called as Vishada*.

KLEDA ACHUSANA

3. RESULT AND DISCUSSION

According to Acharya Charaka Vicharchika is defined as 'Sa Kandu Pidika Shyava Bahu Srava Vicharchika'. Means the skin disease where eruptions over the skin appear with dark pigmentation, itching with profuse discharge from the lesion. Acharya Vagbhata further mentioned Lasikadhya instead of Bahusrava. Accordingly condition in which skin is dry with severe

itching & marked linings present in *Vicharchika*. Furthermore he added that if the same condition appears at the feet with pain, then it is known as '*Vipadika*'. Blackish brown eruption with intense itching and pain is proposed by *Kashyapa*. Acharya Madhava, & Bhavamishra have described almost same definition as Acharya Charaka.

Guna are the potential energies of *Dravya* and *Karma* are the execution of it in the form of kinetic energy. *Guna* form important basis of physiology. Body functions and types of *Dosha* can better be understood if physiology of *Guna* (*Sharir Guna*) is learnt in details. *Dosha* are described by *Acharya's* in term of their *Guna* (quality) and *Karma* (functions). *Vishada Guna* is one of the important *Guna* of *Vata Dosha*. The *Vishada Guna* is the *Viparita* (antagonist) property of *Picchila Guna*. The description of *Picchila Guna* gives the idea about the particular property. In the treatment *Viparita Chikitsa* is always applied, so *Vishada* is applied in case of *Picchila Guna Vridhi*.


For the assessment of *Vishada guna* we had taken two subjective criteria found in the disease which are *Kleda* and *Ropana Kleda* (dampness) of the lesion was statically significant works as *Virukashana* and *Uparohan Karma. Kleda* was decreasing significantly. *Kleda* or dampness of the lesion is significantly decreased by *Vishada Guna*.

Effect of Vishada Guna in Vicharchika

Kledachushan - The mean *Kleda* score before treatment was 1.00. It increased to 1.60 with $SD\pm0.77$ which was statistically very significant.

Ropana - The mean *Ropana* score before treatment was 1.06. It increased to 1.46 with SD±0.67 which was statistically significant.

Vishada Guna is adjective of Vata Dosha. The Vishada Guna which is opposite to property of Picchila Guna, does Shoshana of Sharir Kleda and Vrana Ropana.

Vishada Guna has the property of *Kledachushan* and *Ropana*. According to *Acharya Sushruta* it works with *Virukashana* and *Uparohan*. This can be seen clearly in this study to access *Vishada guna*.

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
